

Wine Charms

Wine charms have been popular for years. They're great at parties so people can keep track of their drinks. They come in a variety of styles and shapes. Most often the little charms are more feminine than manly. It makes sense since women tend to be the shoppers for party supplies.

With Father's Day coming up this week, I thought it would be fun to make some masculine wine charms. I just had to raid my husband's tool box, but you can find all sorts of nuts and bolts at any hardware store.



I still had plenty of old rusty wire left over from the door knob picture holders, and I also nabbed a roll of copper wire which was easier to bend.



You can use any little piece of hardware, as long as it has a hole in it. I found a washer, a nut, a nut and bolt combo and some sort of bracket "do-hicky" with two holes!



Snip off a length of wire 4" – 5" long (you can cut off excess when you are finished) and twist it around the washer.



Then wrap the wire around any glass with a stem. The wider the base, the longer the piece of wire you will need.



Don't twist the wire on too tightly, you will want to remove the charms before washing your glassware. Have fun and be creative! The men in your family will never misplace their beverage again!
