Our favorite part however, is that a trip to Goodwill will help supply almost all of each costume's components! Talk about simplifying Halloween! Keep reading to see how to pull each costume together.

Talk about a classic! Rosie the Riveter is a cultural icon and a powerful representation of women who worked in factories during WWII. Make your statement this Halloween, and kick off your costume building with a trip to Goodwill. You'll head to the men's and/or women's clothing department to look for a chambray shirt; the must-have piece! Depending on how October weather is shaping up, you can either add a pair of denim jeans or shorts to the look. Remember, Rosie the Riveter is a powerful look, which means you'll want equally powerful black boots to don while trickor-treating. Don't forget one of the most important

accessories; the bandana! Look for a red bandana or scarf to complete our costume. (Optional: feeling crafty? Your look will be that much more complete with a "We Can Do It" sign!)



____Tale as old as time... Belle-Beauty & The Beast

While the Beauty and the Beast film is certainly a classic, its resurgence on the big screen this year has transitioned it into a pop culture hit! Everyone can recognize Belle's stunning yellow ball gown, but for this year's costumes, we're keeping Belle simple in her blue and white dress and apron combo. This quaint look can easily be pulled off with a trip to Goodwill! You'll start off in the women's clothing department; look for a simple light blue pencil dress, or A-line dress - either will work perfectly. Cut off the sleeves if you don't find a sleeveless dress. A long-sleeve white shirt underneath the dress will help keep you modest like Belle (and warm!). For Belle's white apron, you may just happen to score one on the shelves, or better yet, create your own using a large pillowcase or sheets found in Goodwill's housewares and furniture department. No fancy stitching required; just a few simple snips with the scissors and you have a custom-fit apron! Then, head to the accessories area to pick up a pair of black flats and a blue ribbon for your hair. And last but not least, Belle can't leave home without her favorite "side-kick;" a good book. Take a walk over to the book department and pick up your favorite novel to carry with you for the evening!

Emojis certainly aren't anything new, but they are undeniably a part of today's pop culture. And every year we're seeing more and more creative ways to pull off the fun looks! We love simple, face emojis because they can work for a single costume, couples' costumes or costumes for an entire group. To pull this look off, you won't have to go much farther than the clothing department of Goodwill! Start in the men's, women's or kid's department, and look for a bright yellow tee shirt. Ladies: if you can find a long yellow tee shirt in the men's department (long enough to wear as a dress), then you'll be set! If not, look for a pair of yellow leggings, jeans or shorts. Your next goal is to find something with a piece of yellow tulle on it. We suggest looking in the kid's department for an already made tulle skirt, or look in the furniture department for a blanket or décor piece that has tulle for you to use. You want the tulle to be long enough to wrap around your waist, as a fun addition to your bottoms. Head back to the clothing department to find small shirts in black and red. You'll be cutting and using these pieces to represent the face, so the kid's department is your best bet for small fabric swatches. Once you've selected your emoji face, and have cut out the shapes, fabric glue will finish off your top.

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FIND A PLATE AT GOODWILL!

Goodwill always has a great selection of porcelain plates. Look for a colorful one in a Halloween hue! You can find baby-safe inkless transfer sheets online.

TRICK

Supplies needed:

- Colorful plate from Goodwill (porcelain)
- Green paint pen
- Black paint pen
- White paint pen
- Gray paint pen

Baby's First Halloween

1. Follow the instructions on the inkless transfer sheets to get your little one's footprints onto the center of your plate. (If your kiddo is older, you can use child-safe paint as well. Because my guy is still too little for paint to be on his skin, these inkless sheets worked great!) Allow to dry.









2. Use your paint pen to write the message "Trick or Treat Smell my Feet" around the outside of the plate! Allow to dry.

3. It's time to turn those footprints into witches!

Using your black paint pen, draw a witch's hat, so that it "sits" above the heel of the footprint. Use your white paint pen to draw eyes and a smile, and your green pen for that iconic witch's hair. If you want to add more detail like I did, you can use your black paint pen to draw arms, legs and even a witch's broom! Allow to dry overnight.

- Ribbon
- Light bulb
- Printed pictures or "Boards" from your Pinterest page
- Silver spray paint
- Hot glue gun
- Craft glue or stapler
- Craft wire or twist ties
- **1.** Attach a ribbon to the back of a large bulletin board.
- **2.** Make giant thumb tacks by spray painting lids from decorative tins. Use silver spray paint, allow to dry.
- **3.** Print pictures or "Boards" from your Pinterest page.
- **4.** Staple or glue Pinterest pictures to the bulletin board.
- **5.** Glue tin lid thumb tacks to the bulletin board and pictures using the hot glue gun.
- **6.** Attach light bulb to the headband with wire or twist ties.

- **3.** Create your wand by wrapping a dowel with duct tape, adding more at the handle end. You want to end up with a tapered wand.

The sky's the limit when it comes to Halloween costume ideas! One of the best ways to put the finishing touches on your Halloween look is with make-up. I love this recipe for DIY make-up, because it makes the perfect base for all costumes, and you can customize the color to your needs!

Supplies needed:

- 2 Tablespoons cornstarch
- 1 Tablespoon solid cooking shortening
- Food coloring (just a few drops otherwise it could stain vour skin!)
- Baby powder

- **1.** As with anything you put on your skin, make sure to test the "make-up" on a small portion of your skin. This patch test ensures you will not have any allergic reactions, as food coloring and corn are common causes for reactions.
- **2.** Mix the cornstarch and the shortening together.
- **3.** To make multiple colors, divide the mixture up into smaller portions. Otherwise, you can make one bigger batch of one color. One batch is enough to cover a child's face.
- **4.** Start by adding 1-2 drops of food coloring to the mixture at a time. Remember not to add too much, or it could stain your skin. Stir with a plastic spoon or Popsicle stick.
- **5.** Use your fingers, or make-up sponges, to apply the color to your costume wearer's face or arms.
- **6.** Finish by applying a thin layer of baby powder with cotton balls.

"Amelia Scareheart" Billboard

Need:

- Bomber Jacket
- Long white scarf
- Tan pant
- Aviator hat
- Goggles
- Costume make-up

Is Amelia Earhart alive and well or is she living the zombie life on some Pacific island? Start in the women's clothing department at Goodwill for Amelia's costume. Look for a bomber jacket (maybe you'll even find a leather one!), beige pants, boots and her signature long white scarf. Real aviators wouldn't be caught dead without their helmet, goggles and scary face paint.



"John Lemon" Billboard

Need:

- Yellow shirt
- Yellow pants
- Yellow fedora
- Green tie
- John Lennon style sunglasses
- Hippie wig
- Lemon

The perfect no-sew costume for your inner hippie. Travel back to the psychedelic '60s in canary yellow pants and shirt. Goodwill's Halloween department has hats, wigs and accessories. Trim a long wig to shoulder length and add a green ribbon to a yellow fedora. If you can't find a green tie, make one! The costume wouldn't be complete without John's iconic sunglasses and a little squeeze of lemon.





"Dr. Zuess" Billboard

Need:

- White sheet
- Gold tablecloth
- Cat in the Hat hat
- White wig and beard
- Red bow tie
- Gold trim and cord or belt
- Foam core board
- Costume makeup

The Olympian God of the universe meets the Cat in the Hat! Make your own Greek toga costume from a sheet and tablecloth. It's as easy as draping both pieces around your body and holding together with a cord belt. If you have a sewing machine, stitch up the sides to make a robe with sleeves then glue gold trim at the hem lines. Check out Goodwill's Halloween department for a white wig and beard. Apply black and white costume make-up for the quintessential cat face. Add a bow tie made from a piece of red felt tied in the middle. Shop early and you just might find that famous red and white stripe hat. Finish the costume off with a lightning bolt cut from a piece of foam core or heavy poster board.

"Happy, Sleepy, Grumpy" Billboard

Need:

- Felt or velour fabric
- Batting from a quilt
- Felt pieces
- Glue
- Ribbon

Let everyone know how you feel without saying a word. This project is geared toward the intermediate sewer. Cut two large circles from felt or velour and sew right sides together, leaving a 6" opening. Turn inside out; add batting pulled out of an old quilt to hold the shape, and then sew up the opening by hand. Cut-out the faces of each emoji from felt and glue to the front. Sew or pin a piece of ribbon at the top to tie around the neck. Kids hands are free to carry a trick-or-treat bucket and it fits over a warm jacket. Get creative, all the kids in the neighborhood can "spell" out a message.





"Sherlock Bones" Billboard

Need:

- Detective hat
- Cape
- Brown pants
- Beige shirt
- Magnifying glass
- Costume makeup

Master sleuth or a coffin escapee? The advanced sewer can make Sherlock's classic cape from hounds tooth fabric and lining for a nice tailored cloak. If your sewing skills are nonexistent, cut a big circle from a tablecloth, blanket or even a full skirt. Or look for a classic trench coat. Hide your identity under that famous detective hat and black and white make-up (don't forget your hands). Of course you need an oversized magnifying glass to find clues and solve mysteries. Maybe *The Case of the Empty Casket*?

Travel back in time to our country's early days. Ben Franklin might be the face on the \$100 bill, but he gets a make-over this year with his new man-bun! Start at the top with a bald head wig and add a hair piece. A bit of lace at the front of a basic white shirt turns it into a revolutionary style. Either make a fancy vest or find one from an old three-piece suit. Cut the pant legs off below the knee and tighten up with elastic for ribbon to make old-fashioned knickers. Wear white knee socks and add buckles to your shoes. You wouldn't be Ben without his famous spectacles and kite.







"Hairy Houdini" Billboard

The great illusionist has turned werewolf! This easy, no-sew costume is perfect for a woman or man and even the kiddos. Start with black pants and a white shirt. You wouldn't be a magician without a hat and cape. And Goodwill is a great source for capes in all sizes and styles. Can't find the right one? Try wrapping a tablecloth around your shoulders or a graduation gown. Just cut off or tuck in the sleeves! Bring out the inner escape artist in you with chains, locks and handcuffs. Add some make-up and costume facial hair or mask and you'll soon be howling at the moon.

Peanut Butter Spider Cookies

Ingredients

- ¹/₂ cup shortening
- ¹/₂ cup peanut butter
- ½ cup brown sugar
- ½ cup sugar
- 1 egg
- 2 tbsp milk
- 1 tsp vanilla
- 1³/₄ cup flour

- 1 tsp baking soda
- ½ tsp salt

chips

- ¼ cup sugar (for rolling)
- 48 miniature Reese's cups, unwrapped and frozen
- 96 candy eyes
 ½ cup chocolate

Chocolate and peanut butter – I don't think it gets any better! These yummy peanut butter spider cookies will be perfect for your upcoming Halloween party!

Directions

- 1. Preheat oven to 375°.
- 2. In a large bowl, beat together shortening, peanut butter, egg, sugar, brown sugar, vanilla, and milk.
- 3. In a medium bowl, whisk together flour, baking soda, and salt.
- 4. Gradually add dry mixture to wet mixture and beat until blended.
- 5. Form into 1" balls.
- 6. Roll in sugar and place a couple of inches apart on ungreased cookie sheet.
- 7. Bake 10-12 minutes or until golden.
- 8. Immediately, gently press an upside down frozen peanut butter cup on top of each cookie and move to wire rack to cool.
- 9. After placing and moving all of the cookies on the wire rack, put in place the candy eyes while chocolate is still slightly soft.
- 10. Place in refrigerator for 10 minutes to allow cookies to firm.
- 11. Put chocolate chips in the corner of zippered sandwich bag.
- 12. Microwave for 20 seconds, knead and repeat until chocolate has melted.
- 13. Clip tiny piece off of the corner of bag to allow for piping and draw eight legs on each spider cookie.
- 14. Place in refrigerator for 10 minutes to allow legs to set.



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Yummy Mummy Pizzas

Ingredients

- 3 English muffins
- 6 tbsp. pizza sauce
- 12 olives
- Red or green pepper
- 3 string cheese

Directions

- 1. Start by splitting and toasting the English muffin, then spread a tablespoon of pizza sauce on the cut side. Add two olive slices for eyes and a bit of red or green pepper for the pupils. Lay string cheese strips across (mummy "wrappings"), leaving the eyes peering through. Bake at 350° until the cheese bubbles, about 10 minutes.
- 2. Serve on your favorite Halloween platter. Enjoy!



5-Ingredient Halloween Pumpkin Truffles

Ingredients

- 1 package (16 ounces) regular Oreos
- 1 package (8 ounces) cream cheese at room temperature
- 1 bag (12 ounces) Orange Candy Melts
- 18-20 green M&M candies
- 18-20 Straight Pretzels
- Optional: vegetable oil you might want to add some to
 make the candy melts easier to work with

Directions

- Pulse the full oreos (no need to separate cream from cookie) in a food processor or blender until it is in crumbs.
- 2. Using a hand held mixer, beat the Oreos and cream cheese together until well combined.
 - 3. Roll the mixture into balls.
 - 4. Chill the balls, covered tightly, for an hour in the fridge.
- 5. Once the balls are chilled, melt the candy melts according to package directions. (This is technically another ingredient, but you may need a teaspoon (or a few) of vegetable oil to get the chocolate thin enough to dip in. Every chocolate is a little different so if needed, just add the oil slowly until it coats the oreo truffles well.)
 - 6. Place a ball on a fork and then spoon the melted chocolate evenly over the ball. Tap the fork holding the ball to remove excess chocolate.
 - 7. Break the pretzels into thirds.
 - 8. Slide the ball carefully onto parchment paper and immediately (it hardens quickly) press a piece of a
 - pretzel into the top of the ball.
- 9. Press and hold an
 M&M at an angle
 next to the pretzel
 for about 20 seconds
 - 101 about 20 s
 - 10. Allow to dry.

You can't do Halloween without pumpkin! These pumpkin truffles are not only adorable but only require five ingredients!
